

# A Project on Inspirational People who have worked for Justice.

You are to complete a project on 5 religious people who have worked for justice. I am giving you a whole month to do this - 7 lessons plus homework, and it is due in on xxxx. You do not have to give equal amounts of information for each of the five people that you choose. You must try to do your best to show what a good student of RE you are.

For each person you should try to include:

- ◆ Some biographical details (e.g. birth date, place, married? children? alive/dead, etc.)
- ◆ What was the injustice they faced?
- ◆ What did they do?
- ◆ What did they achieve?
- ◆ What inspired them to work for justice?
- ◆ How does their story inspire you or other young people?

Use the textbook (*Directions 1*) and your own research (internet, libraries, home, etc.). Present your work as well as you can on A4 paper, using colour and pictures where appropriate. You may use a computer if you wish. You must have your work with you for each RE lesson.

**To get level 4 you need to:**

- ◆ Make a link between how different Christian people have worked for justice and their Christian beliefs.
- ◆ Consider how these inspirational people make you feel about justice and how important it is to you. Do this by asking questions and suggesting some answers about why they were willing to work for justice for others by putting themselves in danger or suffering themselves.

**To get level 5 you need to:**

- ◆ Explain how people of two or more religions put their beliefs about justice into action and what a difference this has made to the lives of the people involved.
- ◆ Show what you think about the example of two inspirational people from different religions and their work for justice, giving your own views about justice and showing how these people inspire you.

**To get level 6 you need to:**

- ◆ Explain with understanding how their faith inspired different people to work for justice in different situations.
- ◆ Explain clearly three ways that young people today might be inspired by different religious people who have worked for justice.

Think carefully about which 'Inspirational People' you are going to choose, to enable you to get the level you are aiming for, some are in the text book others need further research. You can choose any inspirational religious people who have worked for justice, but check before starting! Some ideas are below.
